This writer had the good fortune to attend the 2018 NZSI Auckland Branch Spring Workshop. This year it was held at Rosmini College, Takapuna. Thursday started with a play in the Auditorium and then each instrument had a masterclass followed by a small group workshop.

My young granddaughter had the privilege of being in the group tutored by George Hendry from Christchurch. Masterclasses were held each day for the various instruments, and in the guitar section about 16 students were taught to play as a group in readiness for the Saturday grand finish (a concert in the Auditorium). The group classes concentrated on one-on-one sessions with the individual teachers for each section helping the student to master the set pieces that were chosen for the final concert. Instruments included: cello, flute, guitar, piano, and violin.
